At the risk of stating the obvious, 2020 has been a challenging year. The pandemic changed how we live, forced us to distance and added stress in an already anxious world. It led to an economic downturn that resulted in many people losing jobs and healthcare. And all of this unfolded during an election that can best be described as vitriolic and divisive.

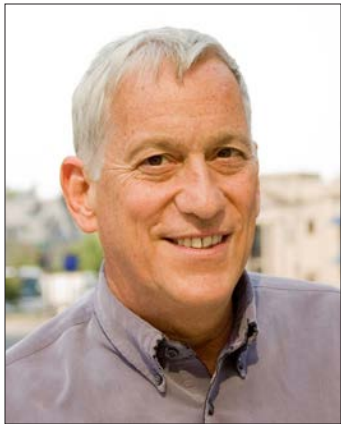

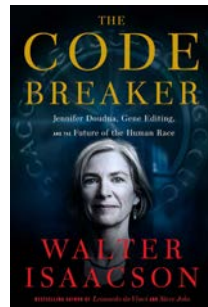
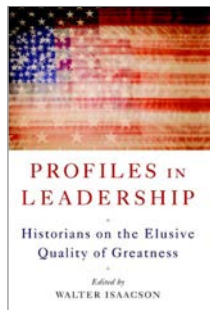
### Walter Isaacson

*Bestselling Author; Acclaimed Historian and Journalist; Professor of History, Tulane University*

**WALTER ISAACSON** is a Professor of History at Tulane and an advisory partner at Perella Weinberg, a financial services firm based in New York City. He is the past CEO of the Aspen Institute, where he is now a Distinguished Fellow, and has been the chairman of CNN and the editor of *TIME* magazine.

Isaacson's biography, *Leonardo da Vinci* (2017), offers new discoveries about Leonardo's life and work, weaving a narrative that connects his art to his science. He is also the author of *The Innovators: How a Group of Hackers, Geniuses, and Geeks Created the Digital Revolution* (2014), *Steve Jobs* (2011), *Einstein: His Life and Universe* (2007), *Benjamin Franklin: An American Life* (2003), and *Kissinger: A Biography* (1992), and coauthor of *The Wise Men: Six Friends and the World They Made* (1986). His next book, to be published in March 2021, is *The Code Breaker: Jennifer Doudna, Gene Editing, and the Future of the Human Race*. He is a host of the show "Amanpour and Company" on PBS and CNN, a contributor to CNBC, and host of the podcast "Trailblazers, from Dell Technologies."

Isaacson was born on May 20, 1952, in New Orleans. He is a graduate of Harvard College and of Pembroke College of Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes Scholar. He began his career at *The Sunday Times of London* and then the *New Orleans Times-Picayune*. He joined *TIME* in 1978 and served as a political correspondent, national editor, and editor of digital media before becoming the magazine's 14th editor in 1996. He became chairman and CEO of CNN in 2001, and then president and CEO of the Aspen Institute in 2003.

He is chair emeritus of Teach for America. From 2005-2007 he was the vice-chair of the Louisiana Recovery Authority, which oversaw the rebuilding after Hurricane Katrina. He was appointed by President Barack Obama and confirmed by the Senate to serve as the chairman of the Broadcasting Board of Governors, which runs Voice of America, Radio Free Europe, and other international broadcasts of the United States, a position he held from 2009 to 2012. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the Royal Society of the Arts, and the American Philosophical Society. He serves on the board of United Airlines, the New Orleans City Planning Commission, the New Orleans Tricentennial Commission, Bloomberg Philanthropies, the Rockefeller Foundation, the Society of American Historians, the U.S. Defense Department Innovation Board, the Carnegie Institution for Science, and My Brother's Keeper Alliance.

## Angela Douglas

Humble and determined are words often used to describe Angela Douglas, the 2020 recipient of the Jeanne and John G. McCoy Community Service Award. Each year, the Foundation recognizes members of our community who have demonstrated significant civic leadership that strengthens the community. In a year that perhaps more than any other presented unforeseen challenges, Angela exemplifies leadership that makes a difference.

Reflecting on the selection of Angela as the 2020 McCoy Award honoree, Foundation Board Chair Lynne Smith said, "By her example, Angela inspires people to come together in service to the community. She has a heart of service that brightly shines in everything she does."

Angela was appointed Executive Director of Healthy New Albany earlier this summer, succeeding Dr. Phil Heit who founded and led the organization since 2005. Prior to that, Angela served as Healthy New Albany's Director of Operations.

Assuming leadership of Healthy New Albany during the pandemic allowed Angela to apply her entrepreneurial skills and she quickly adapted programs to the changing environment.

Healthy New Albany presented 12 New Albany Farmers Markets in a new, safer way because of COVID-19. It also introduced drive-up markets and added new programs including Senior Connections and Integrative Health Classes.

Angela's work in the community dates back to 2013 when she became involved with the Village Coalition Against Hunger, eventually becoming the director of the small nonprofit that helped support the needs of community members experiencing food insecurity.

Her remarkable passion and commitment to make sure no one experienced hunger drove her toward an expanded role. Amazingly, she even operated the pantry from her home for a year while searching for a permanent, suitable location. In its early days, volunteers picked up food from Angela's garage to then deliver to the families.

"I feel like my purpose on the planet is to do good, and to do good work and to serve others in whatever capacity I can," Angela shared with Healthy New Albany Magazine in a 2017 interview. "I don't know if I intended to run a food pantry, but you know, you do what's in front of you. When a need presents itself, you take that."

Through collaboration and support from the New Albany School district, community volunteers and Foundation donors, the pantry relocated to the annex building at 79 N. High Street on the school campus. And eventually, the food pantry became part of Healthy New Albany. It was renamed the New Albany Food Pantry and Angela served as its Executive Director for six years. Today, the Pantry provides clients living in the New Albany-Plain Local School District with food and personal care items and operates a number of programs including Summer Meals, Community Kitchen classes, cooking demonstrations and more.

Despite unprecedented demand, the New Albany Food Pantry has been able to support families and individuals experiencing food insecurity. During the months of January through September of 2020, more than 126,300 meals were provided to our neighbors in need. Additionally, volunteers devoted 3,200 hours in support of the Pantry.

## REMARKABLE CONTRIBUTION



### JAQUELIN T. ROBERTSON

In early 2020, New Albany lost a dear friend, Jaquelin T. Robertson. While you may not have met Jaque personally, he played a critical role in the early planning of New Albany and his impact is ever present as we go about our daily lives here.

New Albany’s distinctive architectural identity is the result of a shared vision. One of the authors of that vision is Jaquelin T. Robertson (1933–2020), a world-renowned architect and planner who, during his half-century-long career, helped America rediscover its own architectural heritage.

Mr. Robertson, known as “Jaque” (pronounced “Jack”), first began consulting for the New Albany Company in 1989. Having recently completed an eight-year tenure as dean of the University of Virginia School of Architecture, he and his New York City-based firm, Cooper Robertson, left an indelible mark on the community. Mr. Robertson led the design of the clubhouse at New Albany Country Club as well as Bottomley Crescent, one of the first streets to open in the Country Club Community. Mr. Robertson also helped craft the community’s master plan, working closely with Les Wexner and Jack Kessler, along with other expert planners such as Gerald McCue and Laurie Olin.

To ensure a consistently high quality of design throughout the community, Mr. Robertson helped train local builders and architects in the art of traditional brick construction. He also wrote some of the design guidelines for the Country Club Community, emphasizing harmonious composition and authentic details in the Georgian style. Mr. Robertson’s knowledge and guidance subsequently informed other architects’ designs for the community learning campus, the New Albany Branch Library, and Village Hall. As the community’s business park began to develop in the late 1990s, Mr. Robertson helped the New Albany Company create appropriate architecture and planning standards so that the commercial buildings would respect the landscape and the scale of the community.

Jaque Robertson grew up in Windsor Farms, Virginia, a graceful residential community on the edge of Richmond. Recalling a typical English village surrounding a common green, it served as one of several key precedents for the planning of New Albany. Mr. Robertson’s love of architecture was fueled by his family’s Georgian-Palladian home,

called Milburne, which was designed by master architect William Lawrence Bottomley—the namesake of New Albany’s Bottomley Crescent. Mr. Robertson also spent part of his childhood in Beijing, where his father, the diplomat Walter Robertson, was stationed. This cosmopolitan environment helped fuel Mr. Robertson’s lifelong interest in urban design as a complement of architecture. Each individual building, he believed, should feel connected to the larger community. The parts should form a whole.

Mr. Robertson earned two degrees from Yale and studied at Oxford University as a Rhodes Scholar. In the early 1960s he worked for prestigious New York architect Edward Larrabee Barnes. He then became a senior urban planner in the administration of New York City Mayor John Lindsay, and took on international planning and design projects in the private sector. Returning to his native Virginia in 1980, Mr. Robertson led the architecture school at UVA, where he looked with fresh eyes upon the Classical tradition in architecture. He believed that Renaissance Italy and Georgian Britain and America still offered relevant lessons. His thinking was encapsulated in his treatise, *In Search of an American Urban Order*, in which he sought to apply Thomas Jefferson’s architectural principles to the challenges of modern life.

When Mr. Robertson came to New Albany, he was impressed with Wexner and Kessler’s vision to build a timeless American community. “To come upon this crowd in New Albany was just such a shock,” he recalled in 2015, during a New Albany Lecture Series panel event at The McCoy. “Les was so committed to quality, and you don’t get that in our world anymore. No one in the country was doing things this way. It was so rare and so incredibly brave.”

Mr. Robertson showed Wexner and Kessler around some of his favorite buildings and communities, from Monticello to East Hampton, New York. When Wexner chartered a flight for roughly 45 Central Ohio builders and architects to go to Richmond for the day, Mr. Robertson led them on a tour of the city’s handsome Georgian homes. They returned with a clearer understanding of the subtle language of brick: specialized bonds or patterns, “grapevine” mortar joints, water tables, arched openings, glazed headers, decorative “rubbed” bricks, and many other techniques.

As Mr. Robertson once said in a *Town & Country* interview, “The symbolic hard currency of architecture is classical. It’s gold in the bank. The other stuff is leveraged buyouts and soybean futures.”

Apart from his work in New Albany, Mr. Robertson is remembered for his role in designing civic and university buildings, museums, corporate headquarters, club/resort environments, and community master plans. He also designed elegant country homes for prominent clients, typically evoking the spirit of older buildings without imitating them directly. He received the Thomas Jefferson Medal in Architecture in 1998 and the Driehaus Prize, an award for excellence in traditional architecture, in 2007.

New Albany honors the memory of Mr. Robertson, and we treasure his enduring contributions to our community.
