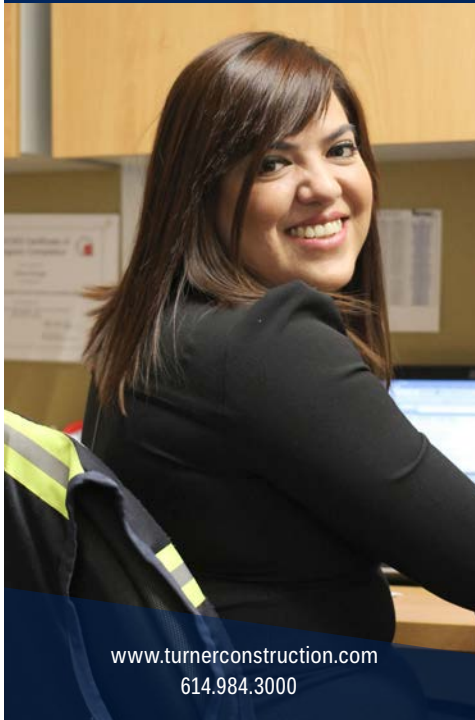

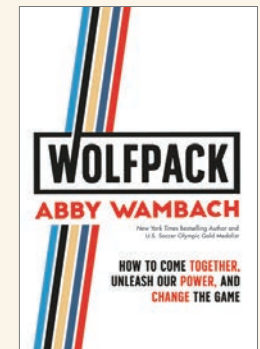
## ABBY WAMBACH

From the co-captain of the 2015 Women's World Cup Champion team to a *New York Times* bestselling author, Abby Wambach's impressive career exhibits what it truly means to be a champion. A two-time Olympic gold medalist, FIFA World Cup Champion, and six-time winner of the U.S. Soccer Athlete of the Year award, Abby was the United States' leading scorer in the 2007 and 2011 Women's World Cup tournaments and the 2004 and 2012 Olympics.



An activist for equality, pay equity, diversity and inclusion, Abby is the author of the #1 *New York Times* bestseller *Forward: A Memoir*, *WOLFPACK*, and the adaptation of *WOLFPACK* for Young Readers. A true leader on and off the field, Abby knows how to drive toward success



with game-changing power and teamwork. In 2020, Abby became a founder and part owner of Angel City FC, the first majority female-owned Soccer team in history. She is also co-founder of Wolfpack Endeavor, a training program that is revolutionizing leadership development for women in the workplace and beyond, and sits on the Board of Directors for the non-profit organization Together Rising.

Abby is a highly sought-after speaker in the areas of leadership, inspiration, family and health and wellness. She lives in California with her wife, Glennon Doyle, and three children.

## DOUG ULMAN

*Chief Executive Officer, Pelotonia*

DOUG ULMAN is the Chief Executive Officer of Pelotonia, which was established in 2008 with the objective to fund lifesaving cancer research and today is a rapidly growing non-profit. In this role, he is responsible for overseeing the strategic vision and direction of Pelotonia and also serves as an advisor to The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center – Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute.



Doug is a three-time cancer survivor and globally recognized cancer advocate. After overcoming chondrosarcoma during his sophomore year of college and malignant melanoma twice since, Doug and his family founded the Ulman Cancer Fund for Young Adults to ensure that all young adults impacted by cancer have a voice and the necessary resources to thrive. With funding from an Echoing Green Fellowship, Doug served as Executive Director of the organization for four years before joining the LIVESTRONG Foundation in 2001 as Director of Survivorship. He went on to lead LIVESTRONG as President and Chief Executive Officer, establishing the organization as the global leader in cancer survivorship.

Doug recently served as a Hauser Leader at Harvard Kennedy School Center for Public Leadership and speaks frequently at some of the nation's most acclaimed festivals and conferences including the Social Good Summit, the Inc. 500|5000 Conference, the Aspen Ideas Festival, the Clinton Global Initiative University, TedxAustin, SXSW Interactive and YPO Chapters across the country. Doug has also spoken to and consulted with numerous Fortune 100 companies and fast-growing startups. Doug's personal story and his leadership accomplishments have been featured on major media outlets including *The New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *USA Today*, *Forbes*, *Sports Illustrated*, NBC News, ABC News and MSNBC, among many others. Doug has been honored with many accolades including twice being named on the *Non-Profit Times*' Power and Influence Top 50 Non-Profit Executives list, an honor bestowed on the top non-profit leaders in the United States. Doug was also named CEO of the Year: Large Non-Profit by *Columbus CEO Magazine* in 2017.

Doug currently holds numerous board positions for organizations such as the Ulman Cancer Fund for Young Adults, the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, Athletes for Hope and ROOT Insurance. He is also an active member of the Young Presidents' Organization (YPO) and The Columbus Partnership. Doug served for four years on the National Cancer Institute Director's Consumer Liaison Group and has served on the Board of the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC), as well as many other philanthropic, healthcare and entrepreneurial ventures.

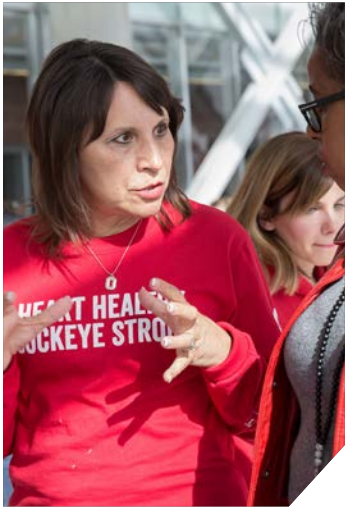

## Strengthening community mental health and well-being through resiliency

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to test our resilience. While it illuminates acts of compassion, kindness and gratitude, it also highlights the need to strengthen our individual and collective ability to respond to and bounce back from stress, anxiety, depression and feelings of isolation – mentally, physically and emotionally.

Researchers at Ohio State partnered with Everyday Health to understand the current state of resiliency. The study revealed that while most people surveyed believed that they have high levels of mental and physical resilience, only about 57% really do. At the time of the study, only 33 percent of Americans are likely to ask for help or counseling when faced with negative situations that are mentally and emotionally challenging. The experience of the pandemic exposed how unprepared many of us were to face stress, sickness and other difficulties.

**Communities are only as resilient their people are strong. Mental wellness IS community wellness.**

It is vital that we sharpen our focus on reducing stigmas and solidify partnerships to support those struggling with their mental health and well-being. As Ohio's flagship research university and central Ohio's only academic medical center, we are committed to advancing evidence-based cognitive-behavioral skills building and support services to improve overall mental health and well-being in the community. Leaders can help by better understanding our communities' needs and the value of investing in programming to support well-being. Together, we have the ability to leverage our collective expertise and resources to increase awareness, spur action and broaden access to education and services. Together, we can create "circles of care" that empower our residents—how and when they need—so they can realize their full potential. Together, we can build healthier, more vibrant.

## Combatting chronic stress from counselor to community

70% of Americans report levels of stress that negatively affect their physical and mental health. Addressing these impacts must be part of our communities' recovery plans.

Mindfulness in Motion, a mindfulness-based intervention, was developed and validated at The Ohio State University College of Medicine by Dr. Maryanna Klatt. This 8-week program enhances counselors' potential to help individuals susceptible to stress implement pragmatic resiliency tools into their daily lives – improving the health and well-being of our communities.

## Stressing Less In Stressful Times

Managing stress is one of the healthiest things we can all do to improve our everyday lives and our long-term health. We’re excited to hear Abby Wambach’s perspective on mental health this evening, and we thought we’d share some of our team’s resiliency tips, too.

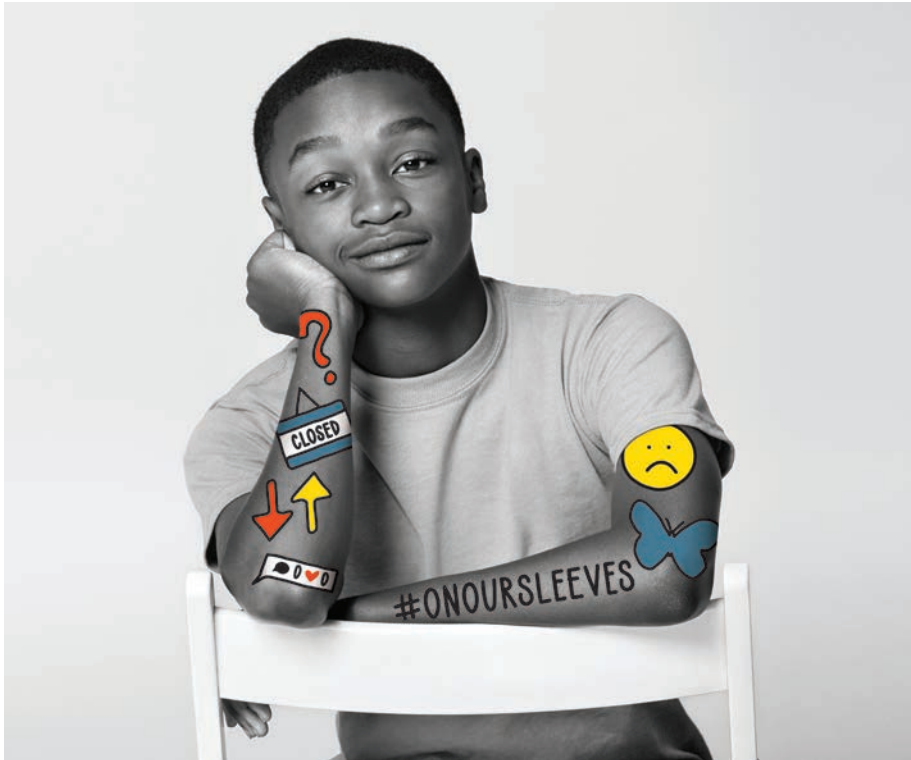
- **Breathe** – Take deep breaths when you’re feeling stressed. It slows you down and can help reduce the level of stress hormones in your body.
- **Look for the positive** – Expressing appreciation, giving compliments, and highlighting successes can put you in a more positive frame of mind, which reduces stress.
- **Find ways to relax** – Do something you enjoy every day. Anything that helps you relax reduces stress.
- **Eat and drink healthfully** – Eating a healthy, balanced diet can help combat the effects of stress.
- **Exercise regularly** – Exercise is a powerful stress reliever. Aerobic exercise has been shown to release endorphins, which are naturally occurring chemicals in your body that relieve stress and make you feel better.
- **Reduce triggers** – Too many demands are not healthy. Focus on the people and activities you value and not the ones you don’t. Saying “no” to extra demands and practicing time-management skills can buy you time and reduce your stress in the process.
- **Set realistic expectations** – It’s possible to do almost everything. It’s just not possible to do everything at once. So be mindful and accept your limitations.
- **Stay connected** – Socializing and staying connected with family, friends, and colleagues reduces stress by helping foster a sense of belonging. So get together safely and enjoy that camaraderie.
- **Get help** – Sometimes no matter how hard we try, we need a little help to improve the way we feel. Thankfully, there are lots of great therapeutic resources in our community. Don’t hesitate to reach out and get the assistance and support you need.

McCoy, namesakes of The New Albany Community Foundation's Community Service Award established in 2004. It is more how the Steinours, like the McCoy's, have a history of investing their time and talents in developing human capital.

The Steinours have been part of the New Albany community since 2009, when Steve was appointed Chairman, President and CEO of Huntington Bancshares Incorporated. Moving here from Philadelphia, they brought their two, then-teenage children and continued a lifetime of impactful community service.

Together, Patti and Steve are a formidable force. Matt Habash, President & CEO of the Mid-Ohio Food Collective reflected on the Steinours' involvement in the Collective's campaign to re-imagine ending hunger, which was launched just before the pandemic took hold worldwide. "We had expected to run a three-year effort. Too slow for Steve and Patti! Through their drive and urgency to get the dollars to work in our community as quickly as possible, their passion and compassion for those who needed us – now more than ever – and their no-nonsense approach in keeping our focus on what matters, we met goal in about a third of that projected journey. We are so incredibly grateful to these two extraordinary leaders who set the pace, the power and the promise that all in our communities will know what it means to have nutritious meals on their tables for their families."

Their individual efforts to make a difference are notable as well.

With more than 30 years as a community volunteer in Boston, Providence, Philadelphia and Columbus, Patti has championed causes focused on affordable housing and literacy. Patti served as a board member of The New Albany Community Foundation for eight years and chaired its grant committee. She also established the New Albany Coffee Club, a group of friends who supported low-income families experiencing financial hardship due to unforeseen circumstances such as health issues, loss of employment or loss of a spouse.

“I met Patti through her Coffee Club and was immediately struck by how selfless and caring she is,” said Angela Douglas, Executive Director of Healthy New Albany. “From the very beginning, Patti supported and advocated for the New Albany Food Pantry, helping secure a grant from the Foundation that allowed us to purchase a freezer. This was a game changer for the pantry and just one of many examples of Patti’s willingness to step forward and help people in need.”

Through Patti’s leadership and hands-on fundraising efforts, the Plain Township Fire Department was able to update and significantly improve the kitchen used daily by the firefighters and staff. “The kitchen is a place where we come together as a team to bond and relieve stress. To have Mrs. Steinour step forward and rally the community to take up the cause of updating this important area for the Fire Department was simply incredible. It makes our department feel appreciated and cared for by the community,” said Chief Jack Rupp of the Plain Township Fire Department.

Patti is also active with TWIG-3, a fundraising arm of Nationwide Children’s Hospital, and she is a founder of the Community Shelter Board Women Leaders Group.

As the CEO of Huntington, Steve supports causes that address economic, social, environmental and racial equity challenges.

“Without Steve, the Columbus Urban League would not be able to make the strides it is making today to empower African Americans and disenfranchised groups through economic, educational and social progress,” said Stephanie Hightower, President and CEO

of the Columbus Urban League. “What’s really extraordinary about Steve is his personal effort to inspire others to be a part of problem-solving. Together with Patti, he is out in the trenches doing the work, and that is saying something about a CEO of a major corporation.”

Many other nonprofit organizations have benefited from Steve’s leadership, including The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center and Pelotonia, where he is a fixture at the launch every year, cheering on volunteers and riders as they embark on their ride for cancer research at The OSU Comprehensive Cancer Center and Solove Research Institute.

Valuing expanded educational opportunities for first-time college students in particular, Steve who is a former Eagle Scout, has provided transformational scholarship funds for central Ohio students.

Steve also devotes time to regional and statewide economic development organizations that contribute to a stronger community including the Columbus Partnership, the Ohio Business Roundtable and The Columbus Downtown Development Corporation.

“Patti and Steve embody the spirit of the McCoy Community Service Award,” said Craig Mohre, President of The New Albany Community Foundation. “When I think of the impact Jeanne and John G. had in Columbus and New Albany, Patti and Steve are operating very much in that same way. They’re strategic, they’re compassionate and they care.”

The Jeanne and John G. McCoy Community Service Award is bestowed annually on a person or persons whose accomplishments, contributions and community service have made significant positive impact in keeping with the Foundation’s mission. ## REMARKABLE IMPACT

Giving is its own reward. Sometimes it also has tangible results. New Albany is a case study in what can be achieved by a community that develops a strong culture of caring.

When The New Albany Community Foundation was established in 1995, few residents could imagine someday building an amphitheater in the Village Center. Few dared to dream of a performing arts venue that hosts hundreds of events each year. The idea of a public library, let alone a library garden, was still a long shot. No thought of upgrading the athletic field of the high school stadium. It was almost impossible to conceive of restoring the once-forlorn Rose Run as a beautiful park with a majestic pedestrian bridge connecting Market Square with the Learning Community Campus.

In the past 25 years, New Albany has accomplished all this and more. The community has learned how to imagine new possibilities—and turn vision into reality. Each new milestone highlights the generosity of local families and companies, as well as the importance of collaboration among public and private entities.

Even amid the trials of the global pandemic, the community has worked together to support neighbors in need. With an eye toward the future, the Foundation continues to organize transformative community investments in lifelong education, the arts, health and wellness, and environmental sustainability.

### **Charlotte P. Kessler Library**

It was in 2002 that the community first unleashed its capacity to build. Together with the Columbus Metropolitan Library, the Foundation raised funds to build and open the New Albany branch library. The Kessler Family, headed by Charlotte and Jack Kessler, gave a leadership gift that helped inspire others to contribute, too. Dedicated in 2003, the Charlotte P. Kessler Library became one of the most used branches in the system. A tribute to Charlotte's longtime advocacy for libraries, it's also the civic and architectural anchor of Market Square.



### **Charleen & Charles Hinson Amphitheater**

In September 2021, the Foundation was thrilled to dedicate the Charleen & Charles Hinson Amphitheater. Conveniently adjoining The McCoy, this open-air theater provides an intimate garden setting for performing arts and events in New Albany's Village Center. The opening of this wonderful cultural space reflects the generosity of the Hinson family and many other contributors, and our ongoing collaboration with public entities. Conceived as a fusion of architecture and landscape, the amphitheater features lush greenery and a timber bandshell canopy facing a series of flexible audience seating areas. Classical architectural details are paired with natural materials and warm amber lighting to create a magical atmosphere, welcoming audiences of all ages.

### **Marie Luise & Michael Marx Family Reading Garden**

Earlier this year, another civic asset debuted at the library. The Marie Luise & Michael Marx Family Reading Garden is a peaceful, reflective space nestled between the library and Rose Run Park. Café tables and chairs, a fountain and a beautiful lawn invite visitors to relax in a beautiful setting. As New Albany city leaders long envisioned, and thanks to the Marx Family's substantial gift, community members can now stroll easily from the library garden to Rose Run Park, the green corridor in the center of town.



### **Raines Crossing**

Spanning Rose Run Creek is Raines Crossing, a graceful bridge and promenade that connects the learning community campus with the library and Market Square. Made possible by a leadership gift from Sandy Raines and Ron Cadieux, it's a beautiful work of architecture that makes the park safer and more inviting for students and residents of all ages. Enhanced trails, play areas, and scenic overlooks, beautifully planned by the City, allow community members to explore and enjoy the restored natural waterway as never before.



### **Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts**

The Hinson Amphitheater has a special kinship with its next-door neighbor, The Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts, dedicated in 2008, prefigured the Hinson Amphitheater in placing the arts at the heart of the community. The McCoy has been the community's gathering place for all manner of performances and educational events, including the Foundation's perennially sold-out New Albany Lecture Series. It was made possible by a leadership gift from John G. McCoy in honor of his late wife, Jeanne, who loved the arts and education. Exemplifying public-private partnership, The McCoy serves a tremendous array of community members, drawing audiences from New Albany and beyond.



### **Philip Heit Center for Healthy New Albany**

Health and wellness are core values to so many community members. Phil Heit, a holistic health and fitness advocate, founded the New Albany Walking Club and the nonprofit Healthy New Albany. These initiatives in turn gave rise to the local farmers market, community garden, and Healthy New Albany magazine. After the City of New Albany built the Philip Heit Center for Healthy New Albany in 2014, Phil donated his time to lead this multi-faceted organization. ### **Veterans Field**

The Foundation was honored to facilitate a campaign led by a group of New Albany families to raise funds to install an all-weather turf field at New Albany High School. With improved drainage and "bounce," the new surface has allowed more athletic clubs and the band to practice and perform on the field year-round. Many parents and others donated to this successful campaign. When Jackie and Ken Krebs made a leadership gift, they opted to name the stadium "Veterans Field" in honor of military veterans in their families and across the community.



### **Grassroots Efforts**

It's not just the largest philanthropic initiatives that define our community. Smaller, grassroots efforts also illustrate the way New Albany comes together to make a difference. Among many such inspiring examples are the Miracle League of New Albany, which allows differently abled children to play baseball on an accessible field, and the Michael Lucey Memorial Courts, named in tribute to a local student athlete who died tragically. Several community groups have also raised funds to preserve and restore historic architectural landmarks like the Ealy House along Rose Run Creek and the Phelps House in the Village Center. In these and other philanthropic endeavors, the community has shown great character.



### **Giving Forward**

New Albany's culture of giving would not be what it is today without Abigail and Les Wexner. When the Wexners made New Albany their home, they dreamed of a community where people not only live well, but also invest in others' well-being. Their contributions to New Albany over the years include land for schools and parks, funding for community initiatives, and hosting the Foundation's annual Remarkable Evening Benefit. More than giving back, they aim to "give forward" to benefit generations to come. The Foundation acknowledges the Wexners' many generous contributions as well as their role in cultivating a widespread culture of giving and mutual care that transcends any single donor.

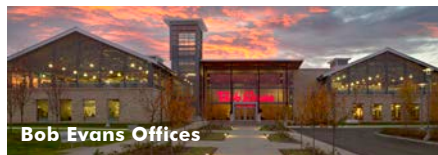

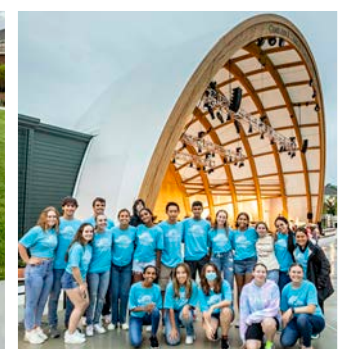
