

PAUL BEGALA

Political Analyst and Commentator, CNN

PAUL BEGALA is a political commentator, a professor of public policy, an author, and political strategist.

He is a commentator for CNN, where he is part of the political team that has won



both an Emmy Award and a Peabody Award. In addition to appearing on-air, Paul writes commentary for CNN, and, with over 200,000 Twitter followers, he has a robust social media presence as well.

Paul is the author of six books about politics, several of which were *New York Times* bestsellers. In the 1990's Paul helped his friend John F. Kennedy, Jr. launch the political magazine *George* and wrote the "Capitol Hillbilly" column. Paul has taught at three universities: The University of Texas at Austin, where he taught in the School of Journalism; the University of Georgia, where he taught in the School of Law; and Georgetown University, where he has been an Affiliated Professor of Public Policy in the McCourt School of Public Policy for 19 years.

Begala burst on the political scene in 1992 as a senior strategist for Bill Clinton's presidential campaign. He served as Counselor to the President in the White House, helping coordinate policy, politics, and media. Before working for President Clinton, Paul worked on Capitol Hill and advised campaigns across America. In 2012 he played a crucial role in the Obama-Biden re-election campaign. Paul has also done campaign work overseas, including in Israel, Europe, South America, the Caribbean, and Africa.

Former President Bill Clinton described his longtime friend and former aide as, "a witty dynamo from Sugar Land, Texas...who brought energy, focus and credibility to our efforts."

KARL ROVE

Former Deputy Chief of Staff, Political Strategist and Bestselling Author

KARL ROVE, an iconic political strategist and one of the most sought-after political pundits of our time, is best known for his provocative and robust knowledge of major political issues. Rove served as Senior Advisor and Deputy Chief of Staff to President George W. Bush. Before the White House, he ran Rove + Co., a Texas based public affairs firm that

consulted on over 75 GOP campaigns for Senator, Governor, Congress and statewide offices in 24 states. Rove writes a weekly op-ed for the *Wall Street Journal*, appears frequently on the Fox News Channel, and is the author of the *New York Times* bestseller *Courage and Consequence*. His latest book is *The Triumph of William McKinley*.

Rove was described by author and columnist Michael Barone as "...unique...no Presidential appointee has ever had such a strong influence on politics and policy, and none is likely to do so again anytime soon." *Washington Post* Pulitzer Prize-winning reporter David Broder wrote that Rove was a master political strategist whose "game has always been long term...and he plays it with an intensity and attention to detail that few can match." Conservative

editor and columnist Fred Barnes, called him "the greatest political mind of his generation and probably of any generation... He knows history, understands the moods of the public and is a visionary on matters of public policy."

From major international conferences to college campuses and intimate corporate events, Karl Rove's shrewd analysis helps him resonate with audiences. Sponsors hosting Rove have reported his remarks "were extremely insightful and very helpful to our industry leaders" (Edison Electric Institute); "stimulating and valuable" (The Fraser Institute); and "provocative, lively and thoughtful" (Nomura); with audiences "often erupting in applause" (Wabash College) and his presentations consistently praised as "one of the highest-rated" (The TriZetto Group).

COLLEEN MARSHALL

Anchor, NBC4 and host of "NBC4's The Spectrum"

Colleen came to NBC4 as a general assignment reporter in 1984 and was promoted to anchor of NBC4's weekend news in 1987. She became co-anchor of NBC4's weekday news programs in 1992.



Colleen received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Point Park University in Pittsburgh. In 2004, Colleen graduated from the Capital University School of Law in Columbus, where she was the recipient of a Trustee's Scholarship, was named to the dean's list and was a member of Law Review and the National Moot Court Team. She passed the bar exam in 2004 and is a practicing attorney.


In May 2020 Colleen was honored with a national Gracie Award from the Alliance for Women in Media Foundation. AWMF recognized Colleen for her outstanding investigative series "Culture of Cover-Up," that exposed the abuse of hundreds of young men over a period of two decades at the hands of an Ohio State University doctor.

In 2018 Colleen was named a Silver Circle honoree by the

Ohio Valley Chapter of the National Association of Television Arts and Sciences, an award given to individuals who have devoted at least 25 years to broadcasting, and who have made an enduring contribution to the television industry and their community.

Colleen has received multiple media and community service awards, including eight regional Emmy awards from NATAS. Notably, she won four Emmys for the health program "I Want To Go Home; A Journey Through Alzheimer's" that documented her mother's decade-long struggle with the disease. She also received an Associated Press Award for that series in 2012, and was honored for her work by the Central Ohio Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association. In 2018, Colleen won an Emmy for political reporting for her coverage of drastic state budget cuts at the Bureau of Children with Medical Handicaps. Her coverage of the presidential election, "The Fight for Ohio," won an Emmy in 2004. She also received an Emmy for historical reporting for coverage of the renovation of Ellis Island. Colleen won an Associated Press Best Enterprise Reporting Award for "Ashville Drug Bust" in 2010.

Colleen has had two one-on-one interviews with President Barack Obama, one of which was in the White House. Her most memorable story was being in New York City for a week, covering the aftermath of the September 11 terrorist attacks.



How do we know that two and two make four? Or that the force of gravity works? Or that the past is unchangeable? If both the past and the external world exist only in the mind, and if the mind itself is controllable – what then?

~ George Orwell, "1984"

Welcome to this evening's program sponsored by the New Albany Center for Civil Discourse and Debate. Now in our fourth year, it is again an honor for our family to present this event in conjunction with The New Albany Community Foundation and this Lecture Series.

Each year of our program, we've introduced it with quotes from history to help frame the challenges of our time. The ease with which words from the past can be found to illuminate the present is a reminder there is little that's truly new in the course of human events. Names, dates, and technologies change but the essence of our struggle to make sense of what's happening around us and to choose a path to follow, both individually and collectively, remains.

What has changed in just the past decade or so is the exponential growth in the volume and sources of information available to us at the click of a button or even the sound of your voice to an always listening automated assistant in your home, office, or the palm of your hand.

We believe the answer is ultimately found when skepticism overrules cynicism and curiosity overrules contentment.

It is in that spirit that we continue to bring these programs to you. It is our wish that by listening to competing viewpoints you will be prompted to ask more questions and to hold the sources of the answers to high standards of evidence, regardless of the topic at hand, or the title, credential, or group affiliation of those sources.

Tonight's discussion features Paul Begala and Karl Rove, again moderated by long-time Central Ohio Journalist Colleen Marshall.

REMARKABLE IMPACT

Giving is its own reward. Sometimes it also has tangible results. New Albany is a case study in what can be achieved by a community that develops a strong culture of caring.

When The New Albany Community Foundation was established in 1995, few residents could imagine someday building an amphitheater in the Village Center. Few dared to dream of a performing arts venue that hosts hundreds of events each year. The idea of a public library, let alone a library garden, was still a long shot. No thought of upgrading the athletic field of the high school stadium. It was almost impossible to conceive of restoring the once-forlorn Rose Run as a beautiful park with a majestic pedestrian bridge connecting Market Square with the Learning Community Campus.

In the past 25 years, New Albany has accomplished all this and more. The community has learned how to imagine new possibilities—and turn vision into reality. Each new milestone highlights the generosity of local families and companies, as well as the importance of collaboration among public and private entities.

Even amid the trials of the global pandemic, the community has worked together to support neighbors in need. With an eye toward the future, the Foundation continues to organize transformative community investments in lifelong education, the arts, health and wellness, and environmental sustainability.

Charlotte P. Kessler Library

It was in 2002 that the community first unleashed its capacity to build. Together with the Columbus Metropolitan Library, the Foundation raised funds to build and open the

New Albany branch library. The Kessler Family, headed by Charlotte and Jack Kessler, gave a leadership gift that helped inspire others to contribute, too. Dedicated in 2003, the Charlotte P. Kessler Library became one of the most used branches in the system. A tribute to Charlotte's longtime advocacy for libraries, it's also the civic and architectural anchor of Market Square.

Charleen & Charles Hinson Amphitheater

In September 2021, the Foundation was thrilled to dedicate the Charleen & Charles Hinson Amphitheater. Conveniently adjoining The McCoy, this open-air theater provides an intimate garden setting for performing arts and events in New Albany's Village Center. The opening of this wonderful cultural space reflects the generosity of the Hinson family and many other contributors, and our ongoing collaboration with public entities. Conceived as a fusion of architecture and landscape, the amphitheater features lush greenery and a timber bandshell canopy facing a series of flexible audience seating areas. Classical architectural details are paired with natural materials and warm amber lighting to create a magical atmosphere, welcoming audiences of all ages.

Marie Luise & Michael Marx Family Reading Garden Earlier this year, another civic asset debuted at the library. The Marie Luise & Michael Marx Family Reading Garden is a peaceful, reflective space nestled between the library and Rose Run Park. Café tables and chairs, a fountain and a beautiful lawn invite visitors to relax in a beautiful setting. As New Albany city leaders long envisioned, and thanks to the Marx Family's substantial gift, community members can now stroll easily from the library garden to Rose Run Park, the green corridor in the center of town.

Raines Crossing

Spanning Rose Run Creek is Raines Crossing, a graceful bridge and promenade that connects the learning community campus with the library and Market Square. Made possible by a leadership gift from Sandy Raines and Ron Cadieux, it's a beautiful work of architecture that makes the park safer and more inviting for students and residents of all ages. Enhanced trails, play areas, and scenic overlooks, beautifully planned by the City, allow community members to explore and enjoy the restored natural waterway as never before.

Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts

The Hinson Amphitheater has a special kinship with its next-door neighbor, The Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts, dedicated in 2008, prefigured the Hinson Amphitheater in placing the arts at the heart of the community. The McCoy has been the community's gathering place for all manner of performances and educational events, including the Foundation's perennially sold-out New Albany Lecture Series. It was made possible by a leadership gift from John G. McCoy in honor of his late wife, Jeanne, who loved the arts and education. Exemplifying public-private partnership, The McCoy serves a tremendous array of community members, drawing audiences from New Albany and beyond.

Philip Heit Center for Healthy New Albany

Health and wellness are core values to so many community members. Phil Heit, a holistic health and fitness advocate, founded the New Albany Walking Club and the nonprofit Healthy New Albany. These initiatives in turn gave rise to the local farmers market, community garden, and Healthy New Albany magazine. After the City of New Albany built the Philip Heit Center for Healthy New Albany in 2014, Phil donated his time to lead this multi-faceted organization. He and his wife Sheryl Heit also donated funds to endow its









Veterans Field

The Foundation was honored to facilitate a campaign led by a group of New Albany families to raise funds to install an all-weather turf field at New Albany High School. With improved drainage and "bounce," the new surface has allowed more athletic clubs and the band to practice and perform on the field year-round. Many parents and others donated to this successful campaign. When Jackie and Ken Krebs made a leadership gift, they opted to name the stadium "Veterans Field" in honor of military veterans in their families and across the community.

Grassroots Efforts

It's not just the largest philanthropic initiatives that define our community. Smaller, grassroots efforts also illustrate the way New Albany comes together to make a difference. Among many such inspiring examples are the Miracle League of New Albany, which allows differently abled children to play baseball on an accessible field, and the Michael Lucey Memorial Courts, named in tribute to a local student athlete who died tragically. Several community groups have also raised funds to preserve and restore historic architectural landmarks like the Ealy House along Rose Run Creek and the Phelps House in the Village Center. In these and other philanthropic endeavors, the community has shown great character.

Giving Forward

New Albany's culture of giving would not be what it is today without Abigail and Les Wexner. When the Wexners made New Albany their home, they dreamed of a community where people not only live well, but also invest in others' well-being. Their contributions to New Albany over the years include land for schools and parks, funding for community initiatives, and hosting the Foundation's annual Remarkable Evening Benefit. More than giving back, they aim to "give forward" to benefit generations to come. The Foundation acknowledges the Wexners' many generous contributions as well as their role in cultivating a widespread culture of giving and mutual care that transcends any single donor.

These are just a few of the milestones that show the community's commitment to shared vision and transformative impact. With continued generosity, hard work and collaboration, there is no limit to what New Albany can dream of and accomplish. ~


